**Psalm 55:22 (NKJV)**

<sup>22</sup> Cast your burden on the LORD,  
And He shall sustain you;  
He shall never permit the righteous to  
be moved.

**Jeremiah 17:14 (NKJV)**

<sup>14</sup> Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be  
healed;  
Save me, and I shall be saved,  
For You *are* my praise.

**Isaiah 53:3-5 (NKJV)**

He is despised and rejected by men,  
A Man of sorrows and acquainted with  
grief. And we hid, as it were, *our* faces  
from Him;

He was despised, and we did not  
esteem Him.

<sup>4</sup> Surely He has borne our griefs  
And carried our sorrows;  
Yet we esteemed Him stricken,  
Smitten by God, and afflicted.

<sup>5</sup> But He *was* wounded for our  
transgressions,  
*He was* bruised for our iniquities;  
The chastisement for our peace *was*  
upon Him,  
And by His stripes we are healed.

**Malachi 3:6 (NKJV)**

<sup>6</sup> “For I *am* the LORD, I do not change;  
Therefore you are not consumed, O  
sons of Jacob.

**Jeremiah 1:4-5 (NKJV)**

<sup>4</sup> Then the word of the LORD came to  
me, saying:

<sup>5</sup> “Before I formed you in the womb I  
knew you;  
Before you were born I sanctified you;  
I ordained you a prophet to the  
nations.”

**Psalm 18:16- (NKJV)**

<sup>16</sup> He sent from above, He took me;  
He drew me out of many waters.

<sup>17</sup> He delivered me from my strong  
enemy,

From those who hated me,  
For they were too strong for me.

<sup>18</sup> They confronted me in the day of my  
calamity,

But the LORD was my support.

<sup>19</sup> He also brought me out into a broad  
place;

He delivered me because He delighted  
in me.

**Jeremiah 29:11 (NKJV)**

<sup>11</sup> For I know the thoughts that I think  
toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of  
peace and not of evil, to give you a  
future and a hope.

**Isaiah 60:1-2 (NKJV)**

<sup>60</sup> Arise, shine;  
For your light has come!

And the glory of the LORD is risen  
upon you.

<sup>2</sup> For behold, the darkness shall cover  
the earth,

And deep darkness the people;  
But the LORD will arise over you,  
And His glory will be seen upon you.

**John 11:4 (NKJV)**

<sup>4</sup> When Jesus heard *that*, He said, “This  
sickness is not unto death, but for the  
glory of God, that the Son of God may  
be glorified through it.”

**1 John 1:2 (NKJV)**

<sup>2</sup> the life was manifested, and we have  
seen, and bear witness, and declare to  
you that eternal life which was with  
the Father and was manifested to us

**Isaiah 58:5-11 (NKJV)**

<sup>5</sup> Is it a fast that I have chosen,  
A day for a man to afflict his soul?  
*Is it* to bow down his head like a  
bulrush,  
And to spread out sackcloth and ashes?  
Would you call this a fast,  
And an acceptable day to the LORD?

<sup>6</sup> “*Is* this not the fast that I have  
chosen:  
To loose the bonds of wickedness,  
To undo the heavy burdens,  
To let the oppressed go free,  
And that you break every yoke?

<sup>7</sup> *Is it* not to share your bread with the  
hungry,  
And that you bring to your house the  
poor who are cast out;  
When you see the naked, that you  
cover him,  
And not hide yourself from your own  
flesh?

<sup>8</sup> Then your light shall break forth like  
the morning,  
Your healing shall spring forth  
speedily,  
And your righteousness shall go before  
you;  
The glory of the LORD shall be your  
rear guard.

<sup>9</sup> Then you shall call, and the LORD  
will answer;  
You shall cry, and He will say, ‘Here I  
*am.*’

“If you take away the yoke from your  
midst,  
The pointing of the finger, and  
speaking wickedness,

<sup>10</sup> *If* you extend your soul to the hungry  
And satisfy the afflicted soul,  
Then your light shall dawn in the  
darkness,  
And your darkness shall *be* as the  
noonday.

<sup>11</sup> The LORD will guide you  
continually,  
And satisfy your soul in drought,  
And strengthen your bones;  
You shall be like a watered garden,

And like a spring of water, whose  
waters do not fail.

**Luke 8:43-48 (NKJV)**

<sup>43</sup> Now a woman, having a flow of  
blood for twelve years, who had spent  
all her livelihood on physicians and  
could not be healed by any, <sup>44</sup> came  
from behind and touched the border of  
His garment. And immediately her  
flow of blood stopped.

<sup>45</sup> And Jesus said, “Who touched Me?”  
When all denied it, Peter and those  
with him<sup>[a]</sup> said, “Master, the  
multitudes throng and press You, and  
You say, ‘Who touched Me?’”<sup>[b]</sup>

<sup>46</sup> But Jesus said, “Somebody touched  
Me, for I perceived power going out  
from Me.” <sup>47</sup> Now when the woman  
saw that she was not hidden, she came  
trembling; and falling down before  
Him, she declared to Him in the  
presence of all the people the reason  
she had touched Him and how she was  
healed immediately.

<sup>48</sup> And He said to her, “Daughter, be of  
good cheer;<sup>[c]</sup> your faith has made you  
well. Go in peace.”

**Psalms 103:2-5 (NKJV)**

<sup>2</sup> Bless the LORD, O my soul,  
And forget not all His benefits:  
<sup>3</sup> Who forgives all your iniquities,  
Who heals all your diseases,  
<sup>4</sup> Who redeems your life from  
destruction,  
Who crowns you with lovingkindness  
and tender mercies,  
<sup>5</sup> Who satisfies your mouth with good  
*things*,  
*So that* your youth is renewed like the  
eagle’s.

**Psalms 147:2-3 (NKJV)**

<sup>2</sup> The LORD builds up Jerusalem;  
He gathers together the outcasts of  
Israel.  
<sup>3</sup> He heals the brokenhearted  
And binds up their wounds.

**Matthew 8:5-13 (NKJV)****Jesus Heals a Centurion's Servant**

<sup>5</sup> Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him, <sup>6</sup> saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented."

<sup>7</sup> And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."

<sup>8</sup> The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed. <sup>9</sup> For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. And I say to this *one*, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does *it*."

<sup>10</sup> When Jesus heard *it*, He marveled, and said to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel! <sup>11</sup> And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup> But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

<sup>13</sup> Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go your way; and as you have believed, *so* let it be done for you." And his servant was healed that same hour.

**Luke 5:11-13 (NKJV)**

<sup>11</sup> So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

**Jesus Cleanses a Leper**

<sup>12</sup> And it happened when He was in a certain city, that behold, a man who was full of leprosy saw Jesus; and he fell on *his* face and implored Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."

<sup>13</sup> Then He put out *His* hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately the leprosy left him.

**Proverbs 3:7-8 (NKJV)**

<sup>7</sup> Do not be wise in your own eyes; Fear the LORD and depart from evil.

<sup>8</sup> It will be health to your flesh, And strength to your bones.

**Isaiah 43:1-5 (NKJV)**

43 But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called *you* by your name; You *are* Mine.

<sup>2</sup> When you pass through the waters, I *will be* with you; And through the rivers, they shall not overflow you.

When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, Nor shall the flame scorch you.

<sup>3</sup> For I *am* the LORD your God, The Holy One of Israel, your Savior; I gave Egypt for your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in your place.

<sup>4</sup> Since you were precious in My sight, You have been honored, And I have loved you; Therefore I will give men for you, And people for your life.

<sup>5</sup> Fear not, for I *am* with you; I will bring your descendants from the east, And gather you from the west;

**Ephesians 3:17-19 (NKJV)**

<sup>17</sup> that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, <sup>18</sup> may be able to comprehend with all the saints what *is* the width and length and depth and height— <sup>19</sup> to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

**Philippians 4:6-7 (NKJV)**

<sup>6</sup> Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; <sup>7</sup> and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

**Matthew 4:23-25 (NKJV)****Jesus Heals a Great Multitude**

<sup>23</sup> And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.

<sup>24</sup> Then His fame went throughout all Syria; and they brought to Him all sick people who were afflicted with various diseases and torments, and those who were demon-possessed, epileptics, and paralytics; and He healed them.

<sup>25</sup> Great multitudes followed Him—from Galilee, and *from* Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea, and beyond the Jordan.

**Acts 9:40-42 (NKJV)**

<sup>40</sup> But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. And turning to the body he said, “Tabitha, arise.” And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. <sup>41</sup> Then he gave her *his* hand and lifted her up; and when he had called the saints and widows, he presented her alive. <sup>42</sup> And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed on the Lord.

**Isaiah 41:10 (NKJV)**

<sup>10</sup> Fear not, for I *am* with you;  
Be not dismayed, for I *am* your God.  
I will strengthen you,  
Yes, I will help you,  
I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.’

**Isaiah 40:28-31 (NKJV)**

<sup>28</sup> Have you not known?  
Have you not heard?  
The everlasting God, the LORD,  
The Creator of the ends of the earth,  
Neither faints nor is weary.

His understanding is unsearchable.

<sup>29</sup> He gives power to the weak,  
And to *those who have* no might He increases strength.

<sup>30</sup> Even the youths shall faint and be weary,

And the young men shall utterly fall,

<sup>31</sup> But those who wait on the LORD  
Shall renew *their* strength;  
They shall mount up with wings like eagles,

They shall run and not be weary,

They shall walk and not faint.

**Psalms 91:1-2, 15 (NKJV)**

91 He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High

Shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

<sup>2</sup> I will say of the LORD, “*He is* my refuge and my fortress;  
My God, in Him I will trust.”

<sup>15</sup> He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him;

I *will be* with him in trouble;

I will deliver him and honor him

**Luke 18:35-43 (NKJV)****A Blind Man Receives His Sight**

<sup>35</sup> Then it happened, as He was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging. <sup>36</sup> And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant. <sup>37</sup> So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. <sup>38</sup> And he cried out, saying, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!”

<sup>39</sup> Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he

cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"

<sup>40</sup> So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him,

<sup>41</sup> saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?"

He said, "Lord, that I may receive my sight."

<sup>42</sup> Then Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." <sup>43</sup> And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw *it*, gave praise to God.

### **2 Corinthians 4:17-18 (NKJV)**

<sup>17</sup> For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding *and* eternal weight of glory, <sup>18</sup> while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen *are* temporary, but the things which *are* not seen are eternal.

### **Psalms 25:2-3 Version (NKJV)**

<sup>2</sup> O my God, I trust in You;  
Let me not be ashamed;  
Let not my enemies triumph over me.  
<sup>3</sup> Indeed, let no one who waits on You be ashamed;  
Let those be ashamed who deal treacherously without cause.

### **Romans 8:31, 37 (NKJV)**

#### **God's Everlasting Love**

<sup>31</sup> What then shall we say to these things? If God *is* for us, who *can be* against us? <sup>37</sup> Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

### **Exodus 14:13-14 (NKJV)**

<sup>13</sup> And Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which He will accomplish for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall see again no more forever." <sup>14</sup> The

LORD will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace."

### **Joel 2:25-27 (NKJV)**

<sup>25</sup> "So I will restore to you the years that the swarming locust has eaten, The crawling locust, The consuming locust, And the chewing locust, <sup>[a]</sup> My great army which I sent among you.

<sup>26</sup> You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, And praise the name of the LORD your God, Who has dealt wondrously with you; And My people shall never be put to shame.

<sup>27</sup> Then you shall know that I *am* in the midst of Israel:

I *am* the LORD your God

And there is no other.

My people shall never be put to shame.

### **Psalms 30:1-3 (NKJV)**

I will extol You, O LORD, for You have lifted me up,  
And have not let my foes rejoice over me.

<sup>2</sup> O LORD my God, I cried out to You, And You healed me.

<sup>3</sup> O LORD, You brought my soul up from the grave;

You have kept me alive, that I should not go down to the pit

### **Psalms 51:1-2 (NKJV)**

<sup>51</sup> Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies,  
Blot out my transgressions.

<sup>2</sup> Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, And cleanse me from my sin.

### **Zephaniah 3:17 (NKJV)**

<sup>17</sup> The LORD your God in your midst,  
The Mighty One, will save;  
He will rejoice over you with gladness,  
He will quiet *you* with His love,  
He will rejoice over you with singing.”

**Malachi 4:2 (NKJV)**

<sup>2</sup> But to you who fear My name  
The Sun of Righteousness shall arise  
With healing in His wings;  
And you shall go out  
And grow fat like stall-fed calves.

**Jeremiah 3:21-22 (NKJV)**

<sup>21</sup> A voice was heard on the desolate  
heights,  
Weeping *and* supplications of the  
children of Israel.  
For they have perverted their way;  
They have forgotten the LORD their  
God.  
<sup>22</sup> “Return, you backsliding children,  
*And* I will heal your backslidings.”  
“Indeed we do come to You,  
For You are the LORD our God.

**Mark 11:23-24 (NKJV)**

<sup>23</sup> For assuredly, I say to you, whoever  
says to this mountain, ‘Be removed  
and be cast into the sea,’ and does not  
doubt in his heart, but believes that  
those things he says will be done, he  
will have whatever he says.  
<sup>24</sup> Therefore I say to you, whatever  
things you ask when you pray, believe  
that you receive *them*, and you will  
have *them*.
